What is the Goldwater Scholar Community?

- Organization connecting of all previous Goldwater Scholarship recipients
- Serves as a platform to connect scholars, provide career development resources, and promote outreach

What is the Goldwater Ambassadors Program?

- Mentorship program facilitated by the Goldwater Scholar Community that pairs undergraduate students with Goldwater Scholarship Recipients
- The program especially aims to reach mentees from backgrounds that are underrepresented in STEM

Program History

- Founded in 2021
- ~50-100 mentees each year
- Mentee Statistics from 2023-2024 cycle
 - 53% identify as underrepresented minorities
 - 70% identify as women
 - 26% are community college students

What can mentees gain from this program?

- Monthly 1:1 meetings to track mentee's progress in developing as a researcher
- Assistance with application and fellowship writing
- Access to Goldwater Scholar Community
 - Seminars and conferences
 - Additional networking

FAQs

Q: Who is eligible to be a mentee for this program?

A: Any undergraduate student with an interest in math/science research can be a mentee. There is no restriction on grade level or demographic group. The mentee application is blind to factors such as grades and previous research experience.

Q: Do I have to apply for the Goldwater Scholarship to be a mentee in this program?

A: Applying for the Goldwater Scholarship is not required, but if you do choose to apply, your mentor can assist with that process.

FAQs

Q: How am I matched with a mentor?

A: The program coordinators primarily match based on general research interest (ex. Math, Chemistry, Life Sciences). If a mentee indicates other preferences, such as being matched with a mentor with a shared identity, we do our best to take that into account as well.

Q: Is there a deadline to apply?

A: We match by a rolling process throughout the summer and fall. It is preferred that you apply before November to get the most out of the program.

FAQs

Q: How much of a commitment is this program?

A: The expected commitment is ~1 monthly meeting with your mentor; however, frequency of meetings can vary based on your needs. This cycle will take place over the 2024-2025 school year, but you can choose to continue participating in the program for additional cycles.

Q: How will this program affect my chance of being awarded the Goldwater Scholarship?

A: Program coordinators/mentors are **not** involved in the Goldwater Scholarship selection process. We hope that mentorship will be helpful as you craft your application, but being a part of the program itself does not influence your chance of being selected.

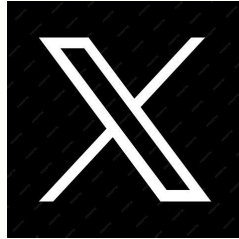
